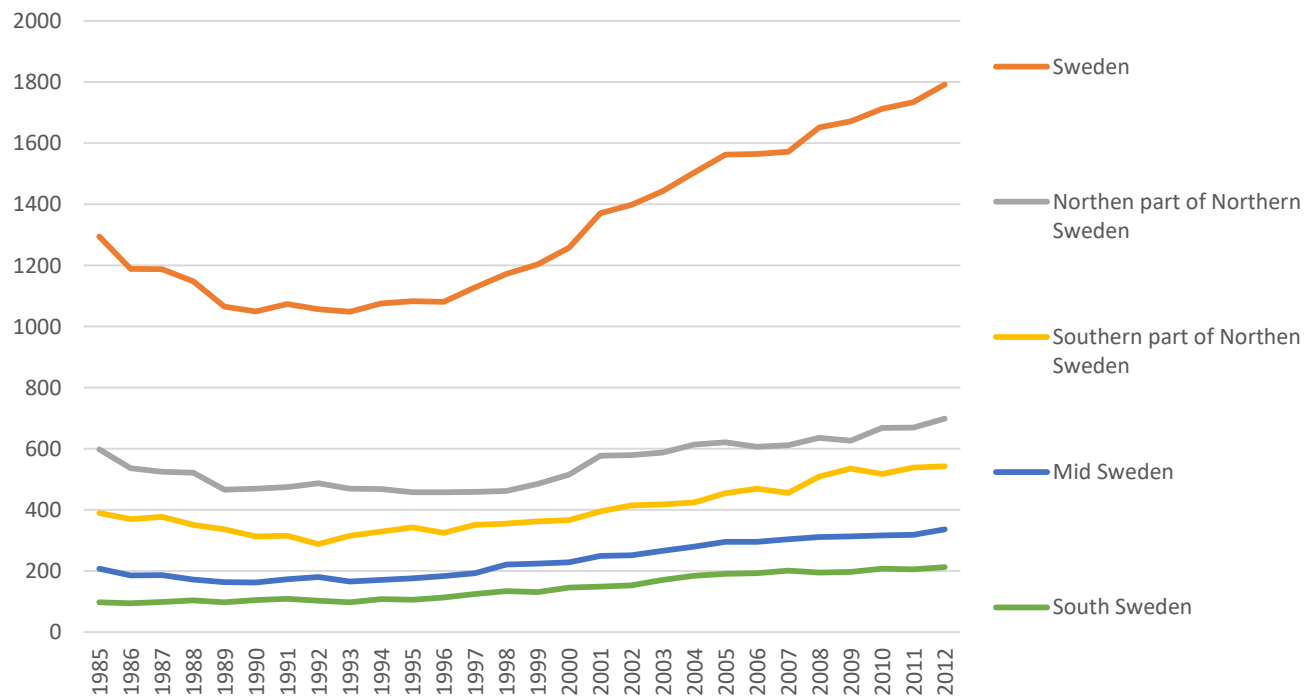

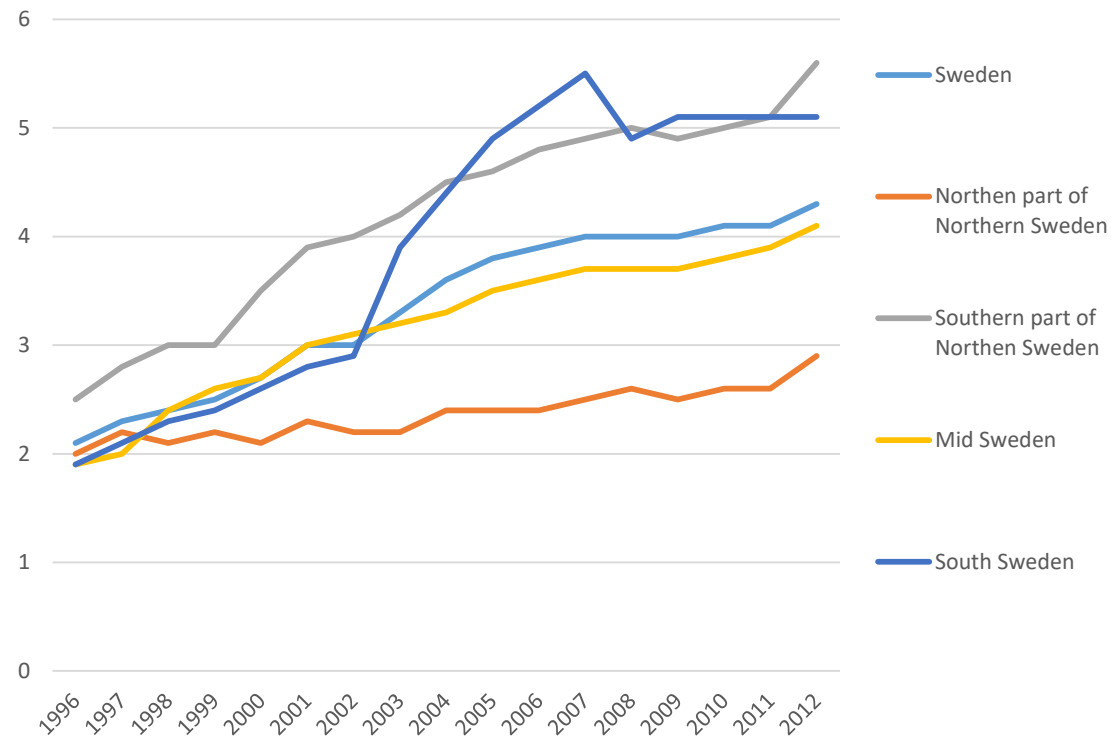


Standing forest (Million m³sk), excl. protected areas (green) and annual felling (million m³sk), excl. protected areas (orange)

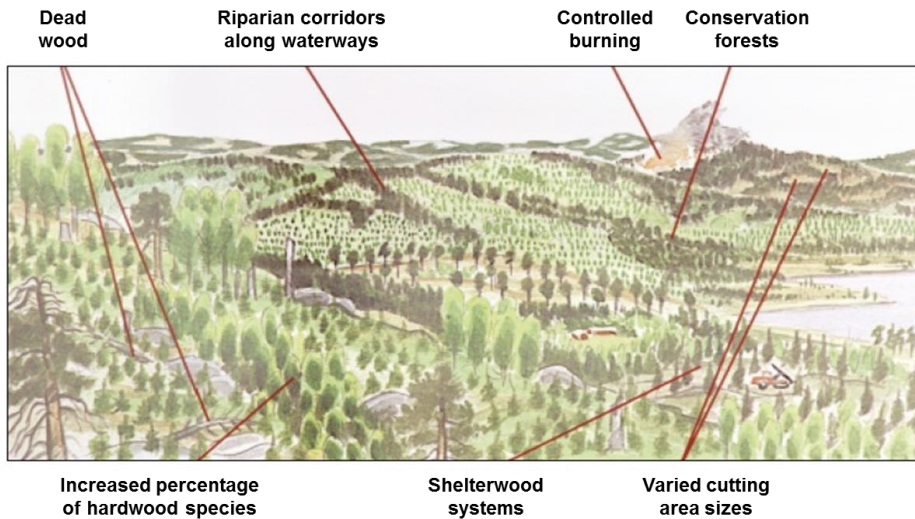
